

Executive Summary

This report seeks Council's approval of the updated Street Naming Police

- The Town's Street Naming Policy was last updated in 2007.
- Updates to the Street Naming Policy are minor and address veteran poppy symbol application, Legion notification, and other general housekeeping items.

The Corporation of the Town of Aurora

By-law Number 6315-21

Being a By-law to assume highways on Plan 65M-4462 for public use -TACC Developments (Aurora) Inc. - Phase 2.

Whereas subsection 31(4) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, (the "Act"), requires a municipality to enact a by-law in order to assume highways for public use, and that subsection 44 of the Act respecting maintenance of highways does not apply to the highways until such time as the municipality has passed such a by-law;

And whereas The Corporation of the Town of Aurora (the "Town") entered into a Residential Subdivision Agreement (Phase 2) with TACC Developments (Aurora) Inc., dated June 24, 2015, with respect to the lands contained within Plan 65M-4462 (the "Development");

And whereas the Council of the Town deems it necessary and expedient to assume certain highways within the Plan for public use and be responsible to maintain those highways;

Now therefore the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Aurora hereby enacts as follows:

- The following highways in the Town of Aurora, Regional Municipality of York, be and are hereby assumed for public use and maintained by the Town:
 - a) Roy Harper Avenue, Plan 65M-4462;
 - Chouinard Way, Plan 65M-4462; b)
 - Folliot Street, Plan 65M-4462; c)
 - d) Constable Street, Plan 65M-4462;
 - e) Hancock Street, Plan 65M-4462;
 - f) McKee Court, Plan 65M-4462;
 - Homer Crescent, Plan 65M-4462; g)
 - h) Bolsby Court, Plan 65M-4462; and
 - Kashani Court, Plan 65M-4462.

- 424 Transport and Rescue Squadron (424 T&R Sqn) officially supports correcting the spelling of the name of the following individual, on a street sign in Aurora, Ontario:
 - Former 424 T&R Sqn Flying Officer Eric Walter Folliott, with ties to Aurora, Ontario, was killed in Action (KIA), while serving with 424 T&R Sqn, during the Second World War.
 - The last name is currently spelled as: Folliot and it should change to the correct spelling of Folliott.



Current policy outlines **a process for renaming a street** as being initiated by way of an **application from a member of the public** or by **council direction**.

Any correction should not be expected to meet the threshold of a Petition of 100% support of residents on the street.

Any costs incurred by property owners to be compensated within reason by the town with a funding source identified for this purpose.

- 1. **Whereas** the Town of Aurora observed April 1st, 2024 and participated in a blue light campaign to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the RCAF.
- 2. **Whereas** Folliot street is named after Flying Officer Eric Folliott who made the ultimate sacrifice while serving with 424 squadron RCAF over France during WWII.
- 3. Whereas each November 11th Aurora observes remembrance day to honor our fallen which includes F.O. Eric Folliott.
- 4. Whereas F.O. Eric Folliott's name is correctly spelt on Folliott's grave marker at Mariseel French National Cemetery, Folliott's grave marker at the King City cemetery, the Alter of Sacrifice in Aurora and the RCAF Memorial Wall in Brandon Manitoba.

- 5. Whereas F.O. Eric Folliott's name is spelt incorrectly on Folliot St. in Aurora.
- 1. **Now Therefore Be it Hereby resolved** that staff be directed to correct the spelling of Folliot St. and communicate to both council and the community of this undertaking and timeline.
- 2. **Be It Further Resolved that** staff undertake sufficient review to identify how this error occurred and introduced procedures to prevent recurrence.
- 3. **Be It Further Resolved that** Street Naming Policy PDS24-090 **not be** approved as written and be referred back to staff with the inclusion of a suitable clause for addressing correction of mistakes differentiating between "renaming" and "correcting".
- 4. **Be It Further Resolved that** the Town of Aurora sponsor F.O. Eric Folliott on the Aurora Legion's *Honor our Veterans Banner Program* covering all associated costs from an appropriate funding source.
